Year 6 Bikeability


Some of the year 6 children have been lucky enough to take part in Bikeability training this week.

Internet Safety



Contacting the school

Please be aware that if you contact the teachers during the school day they cannot be expected to read and respond to your email since they will be



teaching. The teachers may check their emails during their lunch break, however, this is not a school expectation and they will not always have time to reply.

If you are emailing anything to do with attendance, e.g. illness or appointments, this must be sent to attendance@branfil.havering.sch.uk.

If you are emailing regarding a different collection time or arrangement, only let the teachers know if you are able to inform them before 8am on the day. After this time, please email office@branfil.havering.sch.uk. Please note, if the person collecting your child is on the pickup list you do not need to inform the school since they will be released to anyone on this list.

Sharing concerns or making a complaint

We ask that you bring any matter of concern to the immediate attention of your child's class teacher, either in person at the end of the day as you pick your child up or through the year group email. All staff want to resolve any issues immediately so your child looks forward to being in school – please give them the chance to do that. Sharing negative issues on social media does not help your child and often makes a situation worse.

If you still do not feel that your concern has been resolved, the next step is to speak to your child's Year Leader – again, please make contact on the playground or through the year group email. Urgent issues can of course be raised by telephone alternatively.

Any issue that needs further support to resolve will be passed to a member of the leadership team and contact will be made, usually by telephone initially, often followed up by a meeting in person.

In the unlikely event that a resolution has not been found by this point, then we have a comprehensive Complaints Policy (available on the website), explaining what to do next.

Thank you in advance for your support in working in partnership for the benefit of your child.

Break-time Snacks and Drinks

Fresh water is available for use by the children throughout the day. No other drinks will be allowed in classrooms but children may bring a bottle or carton to drink with their lunch. These should be stored on their class lunch trolley at the beginning of the day.

In Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, children are provided with a piece of fruit or a vegetable each day during morning break, funded by the government.



In Years 3-6, children are allowed to bring in fruit or vegetables from home for break-time. These should be labelled and put in the class basket daily, not left in their packed lunch bag as this can cause disruption at playtime.



Please note, WE ARE A NUT FREE SCHOOL. We have pupils who have severe nut allergies which can be life threatening so no products containing

nuts can be brought into school. Thank you for your cooperation.

Water Bottles

Please remember to send a named water bottle into school with your child each day. This should be plastic, reusable, approximately 500ml capacity (so it will fit into our carry crates) and clearly labelled with child's name and class. Only plain water is allowed.

Free School Meals/Pupil Premium

Although this year all children in Reception through to Year 6 do not have to pay for school dinners, if you are in receipt of benefits, you may be entitled to Pupil Premium. By registering for Free School Meals/Pupil Premium now, you may be entitled to register with Havering's School Meal Holiday Scheme, which provides £15 per child per holiday week, as well as receive help from school with things like uniform, school trips, etc. For further details or to apply please go to: https://www.havering.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals

Absent from School

Appointments should be made outside of school hours. If it is not possible to arrange a medical appointment, including doctors, dentist, opticians or hospital appointments, outside the school day, please send a copy of your appointment by text or email to: attendance@branfil.havering.sch.uk.

This is necessary in order for the absence to be authorised. Please email in advance of the appointment to ensure that the teacher is aware and your child/children are sent to the office ready for you to collect.

Please remember to contact the school when your child is absent on a daily basis. You can either email: attendance@branfil.havering.sch.uk or telephone the school on 01708 225186 and press option 1 if you wish to leave a message. Please leave your child's name, class and reason for absence. Please do not just say your child is unwell as we need to record a reason. If you wish to speak to a member of the office staff, please hold on the line and your call will be answered.

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea, they will need to remain off school for 48 hours after the symptoms have cleared.

Authorised and Unauthorised Leave

We strongly recommend that holidays are not taken during term time since these cannot be authorised. For any other planned absence, in the event that this cannot be avoided, a formal request should be submitted as soon as it is anticipated and, where possible, before the absence. A leave of absence request form **must** be completed, assessible from the school office or by emailing: attendance@branfil.havering.sch.uk. The headteacher may require evidence to support any request for leave of absence.

Only the school, within the context of the law, can approve absence, not parents or carers. The headteacher will only grant a leave of absence to a pupil during term time if they consider there to be 'exceptional circumstances' (this does not include family holidays, weddings or birthdays).



The local authority can fine parents for the unauthorised absence of their child from the school, where the child is of compulsory school age.

If issued with a fine, or penalty notice, each parent must pay £60 within 21 days or £120 with 28 days. The payment must be made directly to the local authority. If the payment has not been made after 28 days, the local authority can decide whether to prosecute or withdraw the notice. O:\Primary\Attendance\Authorised and Unauthorised Leave.pdf

School start time

A reminder that the back and front gates are open between 8.35 am and 8.45 am for children to arrive in school.

Any children who arrive after this time will receive a late mark. The minutes late, and reason for lateness, have to be entered onto our registration system, and the office staff will also ask for your child's lunch requirement – this can all mean a delay (especially if parents/carers have not consulted the menu in advance).

Reminder – pick up times

Please can all parents and carers ensure that they enter the playground via the front or back gate at the correct times:

Reception – 3:10pm Year 1, 2 and Year 3 – 3:15pm Year 4, 5 and 6 – 3:20pm



These staggered times help to ensure that the children leave school safely at the end of the day. Please remember to enter the playground at the designated time, line up in front of the correct class and once you have collected your child leave promptly. If you have more than one child to collect, please wait at the back of the playground until the next time slot. Managing the exit of all our pupils safely requires careful planning and organisation. By adhering to the times you are supporting us to maintain safe routines. Thank you.

Action for all settings: Share information on Measles/ MMR vaccination

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. Education settings are being asked to share key messages from the NHS about MMR / measles and how to get vaccinated.

The Back to school MMR Guidance from the NHS includes information to share, as well as example social media posts which can be found here: NHS Vaccine Poster and NHS MMR Poster.

Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious. Parents are highly encouraged to get their children vaccinated.

Support children and young people to take part in The Big Ambition survey

The Children's Commissioner for England has recently launched 'The Big Ambition' to hear directly from children, young people, and parents across the country. This is an opportunity to hear from all children, in every part of the country and in every setting. The survey will be used to encourage policymakers to think about children and young people's needs, to ensure children's voices are reflected in the decisions that will affect them in years to come.

Flu immunisation for pupils in school years Reception - Year 11

DEAR PARENT/CARER,

The flu vaccine is being offered at your child's school again this autumn/winter.

To give consent for your child to have the flu vaccine, please click here:

Even if you do not wish for your child to have the vaccine, please complete the online form so that we can record your wishes.

THE NASAL FLU VACCINE

THE IM FLU VACCINE

We also offer the flu vaccine as an injection, which is gelatinefree. This may also be the vaccine of choice for vegans. Please go to our website where you can find out more about the manufacturing of the flu injection, and then decide if the injection is more suited to your child.

You only need to complete one consent form for each child. If you later change your mind, please call your local team. If your child has this immunisation elsewhere after you have submitted the consent form, you MUST inform Vaccination UK rather than the school.

We understand that you may have questions about the vaccine. For more information, please go to our website, where you can find a list of FAQ's, as well as details of our community catch up clinics. We also have some FAQ's enclosed below.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

*The consent form needs to be signed by a person with parental responsibility which includes:

- Mother: automatic
- · Father: if married to the mother either when baby is born or marries subsequently
- Unmarried father: if name appears on birth certificate (since 1/12/03) or legally acquired
- Others: if parental responsibility is legally acquired
- Parental Responsibility Agreement: signed, properly witnessed and sent for registration to Principle Registry or the Family Division (High Court)
- · Residence Order: granted by the Court

Please note that young people under the age of 16 can give or refuse consent if considered competent to do so by nursing staff.

FREQUENTLY ASKED ??? QUESTIONS

Are there any side effects of the vaccine?

Possible side effects are: decreased appetite, headache, a runny or blocked nose, and sometimes a raised temperature. These are common, but they pass quickly and can be treated with paracetamol or ibuprofen if you feel your child needs it.

Are there any children who shouldn't have the nasal vaccine?

You should let us know if your child has any of the following:

- A very severe allergy to eggs, egg proteins, gentamicin or gelatine – it is important for us to know if your child has been admitted to hospital with a condition called anaphylaxis, triggered by these things.
- Are currently wheezy or have been wheezy in the past 72 hours with asthma. There is an alternative flu vaccine that we can talk to you about to ensure that your child is protected as soon as possible.
- · Have a condition that severely weakens their immune system.

Also, children who have been vaccinated should avoid close contact with people with very severely weakened immune systems for around two weeks following vaccination (By severely weakened, we generally mean people who are isolating, such as those who have received some types of chemotherapy or people who have had a bone marrow transplant, for example). This is because there's an extremely remote chance that the vaccine virus may be passed to them.

Contact with other healthy children or adults does not need to be limited after having the vaccine.

We do not eat pork products. Can my child have a different flu vaccine?

Yes. There is a flu vaccine available, in the form of an injection.

The nasal flu vaccine is the best vaccine for children and young people under 18 years of age as it is more effective at stopping the spread of flu and it is painless, but it does have a highly processed form of gelatine (porcine gelatine), which is used in a range of many essential medicines. The gelatine helps to keep the vaccine viruses stable so that the vaccine provides the best protection against flu.

If your faith or beliefs mean you would prefer a vaccine that has no pork (porcine gelatine) in it, please complete the consent for the flu injection only. You do not need to complete a form for both.

If your child is vegan, please note that the flu injection is a cell based vaccine. For more information, please see our FAQs page on our website:

CAMHS parent/carer consultations are available on **Wednesday 11th October 2023**. These are usually held via telephone call or virtual meeting.


These consultation sessions are designed for parents/carers to discuss concerns they may have about their child's emotional health and wellbeing and to be signposted to key services.

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
