Dear parents/carers

Re: Fundraising for 2023-24

I felt it would be useful, once again, to set out the fundraising that we intend to do this year. We want to continue to raise money for local and national charities. However, with the ever-increasing funding issues that schools are facing, fundraising for the school continues to be essential to enable us to provide the high quality experiences and resources that the pupils deserve. I am ever mindful though of relying on everyone's goodwill with this, particularly at a time when some families will be experiencing significant financial pressures. I would like to reassure you that your child will not be disadvantaged if you are unable, or choose not, to support the fundraising that we do. As always, we are extremely grateful to those who are able to, so thank you in advance for your support.

Sponsored events

We will be organising three sponsored events this year, one each term. Money raised will support our current school improvement priorities e.g. further developing our early reading provision; providing access to a wide variety of diverse reading materials for all children; continuing to improve our play time provision through OPAL.

Charity work and other fundraising

- Harvest collection: donations for Tapestry Care UK (earlier this term)
- #Hello Yellow: donation to wear yellow to support young people's mental health on World Mental Health Day (earlier this term)
- Children-in-Need: donation to wear non-uniform & and sale of Pudsey merchandise (17th November 2023)
- Red Nose Day: donation to wear non-uniform (15th March 2024)
- Book sale: children purchase second hand books to fund new books for the libraries
- Playground activity: Branfil Parliament groups may organise a simple fund raiser e.g. Lucky Bucket at drop off and pick up times
- Y6 mini market: variety of stalls for children to enjoy, with funds raised spent on something for the school that the Y6 children choose.

Our fantastic PTA continue to organise a wide range of events throughout the year. The events are intended to give the children opportunities that they may otherwise not get whilst also raising money for the school. Some of the ways that Friends of Branfil has helped the school over the last few years include:

- providing the money to install the new sandpit in the main playground for all children to access at break times
- o purchasing a wide range of Read Write Inc books and resources to support our early reading provision
- \circ paying to install new play equipment for our younger children in the quad
- providing curriculum resources and general playground equipment
