Dear parents and carers

Welcome to our fortnightly community newsletter. You will receive the usual fortnightly newsletter



with all the school news next week. This one will focus mainly on any additional news in the community that may interest you. Following parental feedback, I hope that these new arrangements will make all of the useful information that we provide easier to digest!

Please see the first 'article' about the National drive to improve school attendance. The average school attendance for primary schools in Havering is 94% slightly higher than the national average of 93.7%. At Branfil our attendance is currently 95.4%, however, this includes 14 pupils with attendance under 75% and it is still not as high as our target.

In addition we are trying to tackle lateness. Any lateness over 30 minutes has to be recorded as a U on the school register, which is an unauthorised absence. Every minute lost means the children are losing out on learning, and this can have a major impact longer-term: "Being just five minutes late each day adds up to three lost school days [over a year]; being 15 minutes late is the equivalent to 10 lost days."



Please help us by ensuring your child attends school unless they are too unwell to do so, and arrives on time each day.

Major National Drive to Improve School Attendance

Thereis a national drive to improve school attendance. The campaign strapline is **"moments matter, attendance counts"**. Messaging for the communications have been developed from research into parental attitudes, as well as two local authority pilots at the end of 2023. Campaign messages aim to primarily reach those parents and carers whose children are taking preventable odd days of absence – or "avoidable absence" – rather than children who face greater barriers to attendance, such as those with long term medical needs or special educational needs and disabilities.

The campaign seeks to **influence parents and carers' views** on the importance of school attendance. They aim to reassure parents that the NHS and Chief Medical Officer say it is appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses, including general cold symptoms like a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat.
